

## **Waupaca Historical Society Launches Capital Campaign**

Since 1953, the Waupaca Historical Society has worked to preserve the rich history of Waupaca and the Chain O'Lakes. What began as efforts to preserve one of the oldest buildings in the City of Waupaca has grown to include the preservation of four sites and

four buildings, an evergrowing artifact and archival collection, and monthly programs and community outreach. WHS has become a community partner with the City of Waupaca, the Waupaca School



District, library, local businesses, and numerous arts and cultural organizations. We serve as a historical resource for our community and researchers and are an advocate for preserving our local history and stories for future generations.

This year, the Waupaca Historical Society embarks on its first Capital Campaign. Our fundraising goal of \$400,000 will help us preserve and enhance our four buildings—the Holly History and Genealogy Center, the Hutchinson House Museum and King Cottage, and the Railroad Depot.



The Waupaca Historical Society has been a part of our community for nearly 70 years—collecting, preserving, and sharing the stories, buildings and objects that define who we are, where we came from and who we are today. Every resident, past and present, is part of our community's story. With your help, the Waupaca Historical Society can continue to tell and preserve these stories for generations to come.

This year, the Waupaca Historical Society embarks on its first Capital Campaign. Our fundraising goal of \$400,000 will help us preserve and enhance our four buildings—the Holly History and Genealogy Center on South Main Street, the Hutchinson House Museum and King Cottage in South Park, and the Railroad Depot on Oak Street—along with our new property on Balch Street.

## Campaign Goal: \$400,000

#### General Operations:

- Additional staff/office upgrades—add one parttime staff for volunteer coordination, rentals/ programs and office/collections assistance; add office area/furniture/technology for additional staff person.
- Digitizing collections/exhibits—upgrade for online collections and exhibit software; technology for digitization/photography; online storage of digitized records; training and additional staff for digitization; outside services for digitizing.



- Exhibit technology—addition of interactive exhibits at all buildings, including but not limited to touchscreen tablets/panels.
- Endowment







## Campaign Goal: \$400,000

#### **Holly Center:**

- Lower level interior/audio/technology upgrades—add Loop/hearing assistance to meeting room; upgrade flooring, walls, and seating; upgrade technology including screen and projector.
- New roof
- Collections storage—create secure collections storage through new walls/locking doors; add archivally safe shelving and boxes for collections; add UV filters for windows.
- Kitchen upgrade/renovation—add more storage for non-collections items and for use by rentals/ community groups; update flooring, lighting and ceiling.

#### **Hutchinson House**

New HVAC system


#### Depot:

• Storage shed—for storage of non-collections items that are currently stored with collections.

#### **Balch Street property:**

 Collections storage building—for storage, display and restoration of large implements, transportation objects, tools and other items that WHS cannot currently accept.

### Lost Arts Featured at the Hutchinson House in June

Step back in time as the Waupaca Historical Society hosts "Lost Arts" at the Hutchinson House Museum on Sat., June 25 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. The event will feature arts, crafts, and hobbies common in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Demonstrators will show how they are keeping these arts alive from wood carving and spinning wool to basketweaving, rug-hooking, and blacksmithing. Families can take part in family activities like weaving and quill writing, along with other interactive demonstrations. Demonstrators will be in tents. around the Hutchinson House and also inside the museum and King Cottage.

Visitors can also enjoy old-time music from Flip o' the Coin from the Hutchinson House porch! Tours through the historic home will be offered throughout the day. Food and beverages will also be available at WHS's brat fry that day.

stories in his upcoming presentation, "The Making of Pioneer Wisconsin: Voices of Early Settlers" on Thurs., May 19 at 6 p.m. at the Holly Center.

Stevens will provide an intimate glimpse into the lives of these early settlers, as they describe what it

felt like to be a teenager in a wagon heading west or people settled in Wisconsin an isolated young wife living far from her friends and family. Stevens will present first-person accounts that form a fascinating narrative to help us understand Wisconsin's early pioneers.

> Dr. Michael Stevens spent much of his career with the Wisconsin Historical Society, where he served as the Wisconsin State Historian and State Historic Preservation Officer. Since his retirement in 2013, he has continued to research, write, and speak about history.


On May 3, the Waupaca Historical Society held a player piano program at the Depot as part of the


