The last Hutchinson House program of the summer will be "Civil War Living History Day" on Sat., August 14 from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. The program in South Park will feature Civil War reenactors at stations around the Hutchinson House, each demonstrating a part of life during the Civil War—both on the battlefield and at home.

Marching demonstrations will take place in the large grassy area north of the Hutchinson House Museum. Rifle demonstrations will take place at 11 a.m., 1 p.m. and 3 p.m.

On Sat., Sept. 18, the Hutchinson House Museum will be open for tours during the annual Fall-o-Rama event in South Park from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

#### **Legend of Chief Waupaca Subject of November Program**

For many years, stories have been told about the history of Waupaca—not only its early inhabitants but also the origin of the city and river's names.

On Thurs., November 11, Ray Reser, professor emeritus of archaeology at UW-Stevens Point, will bring light to both the history and legends of Waupaca in his program, "The Legend of Chief Waupaca." The program will take place at 6 p.m. at Danes Hall, 301 N. Main Street.

Waupaca, or 'Wapahkoh' in the Menominee language, is variously translated as "seen clearly at first light" or "place of tomorrow seen clearly" and likely refers to the morning light over the river.

According to Reser, the area that is now Waupaca, , although used in the late historic era by multiple tribes was traditional Menominee territory for hundreds, if not thousands of years. The Menominee have much oral history regarding the Chain O' Lakes, or 'Sisepikamwi' translated as "sprawling water, like an animal basking in the sun."

After white settlers began to reside in Waupaca, many stories were told about a Chief Waupaca, possibly a member of a Potawatomi family that

temporarily camped near Waupaca. These stories led to an understanding that the city and river were named after such a chief.

Reser will delve into these legends and the prehistory of the Waupaca area, including the Menominee and Potawatomi relationships to the area, at his program. Refreshments will be served. This program is sponsored by Bob and Anita Olson, Waupaca Chiropractic Center, and Ron and Rose Marie Reynolds.


